



FUNDING AND SUPPORT FOR PROFESSIONAL AND PUBLIC EDUCATION

One of the GWEP Coordinating Center's (GWEP-CC) objectives is to offer access and assistance with content and resources for professional and public education to support your work.

Activities to achieve this objective:

- Provide **\$2000 annually** for GWEPs to purchase clinical content, memberships, or meeting registrations of their choosing **to support your site's informational and networking needs.**
- Provide access to public education materials for older adults and their caregivers, available through the **AGS Health in Aging Foundation** website, **HealthinAging.org**, **Practicing Physician Education Project** tool kits, and assist the GWEPs in updating existing public education content as needed.
- **POGOe** submission support.

Process: Complete the online request form, which will be emailed to all GWEP PDs and posted to the GWEP Online Community. Requests will be reviewed and approved on a rolling basis. All 2018 requests must be submitted by **Friday, March 9, 2018.**

The form will include questions related to GWEPs' and their collaborators' (non-profit community based organizations and primary care organizations) interest in receiving:

- Funds for clinical content on geriatricscareonline.org/memberships/meeting-registrations
- Access to AGS Health in Aging Foundation materials
- POGOe submission support

[Practicing Physician Education Program](#) Toolkits

The Practicing Physician Education (PPE) Project began in 1997 and has been funded by the John A. Hartford Foundation through the American Geriatrics Society. The PPE Project was designed to assist primary care physicians in providing better office-based care of their older patients. One component of the project has trained facilitators to offer clinical materials (the tool kits) in an interactive format with small groups of practicing physicians. The facilitator introduces conceptual and factual information; participants discuss this practical information and how to apply it through brainstorming exercises, case discussion, and personal goal setting for their own practices.

The tool kits in the PPE Project offer the physician and office staff an organized approach that is coordinated with specially designed educational materials for patients. The handouts provided with each tool kit supplement the physician's efforts to prepare the patient and family for their roles in making decisions during the evaluation and in the early stages of the management of any chronic condition. Tool kits are currently available on:

- Memory Loss
- Urinary Incontinence
- Depression
- Falls
- Heart Failure
- Persistent Pain Management

The Portal of Geriatrics Online Education (POGOe) is free collection of expert-contributed geriatrics educational materials for educators and learners. Our materials are available digitally and use various teaching methods. Our mission is to encourage the free exchange of teaching and assessment materials in order to promote geriatrics education in the fields of geriatrics and gerontology.

Funded by the Donald W. Reynolds Foundation, POGOe is managed by the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai, Department of Geriatrics and Palliative Medicine, on behalf of the Association of Directors of Geriatric Academic Programs (ADGAP). The site is operated through a partnership of the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai and Vanderbilt University School of Medicine, Department of Biomedical Informatics and Division of Geriatrics.

- [Association of Directors of Geriatric Academic Programs \(ADGAP\)](#): A membership organization committed to advancing academic geriatrics programs and supporting academic geriatrics program directors in order to benefit and aid patient care, research, and teaching programs in geriatric medicine within accredited medical schools located in the United States. ADGAP has built and fostered new methods of facilitating the development of leadership skills among academic geriatricians and has provided an ongoing forum for Program Directors and leaders in academic geriatrics to discuss the wide variety of issues that they encounter.
Dues: \$400/year
- [American Geriatrics Society \(AGS\)](#): A not-for-profit organization of nearly 6,000 health professionals devoted to improving the health, independence and quality of life of all older people. The Society provides leadership to healthcare professionals, policy makers and the public by implementing and advocating for programs in patient care, research, professional and public education, and public policy.
Dues: \$399/year (physician), \$310/year (other healthcare professionals)

Dues: \$248/year
- [Association for Gerontology in Higher Education \(AGHE\)](#): A membership organization of colleges and universities that offer education, training, and research programs in the field of aging. AGHE currently has more than 160 institutional members throughout the United States, Canada, and abroad.

These advance practice nurses are active in a variety of settings across the continuum including primary, acute, post-acute and long-term care.
